

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## How do I register?

:: Registration opens 2/15 for students registered for the 2022-2023 school year at SLKF and 3/1 for everyone else. You can download a copy of our registration form from our website (<https://slkfschool.com/camp-crusader/>) or pick up a registration form in our school office between 7:30 am and 6:00 pm Monday-Friday. Space is limited! We encourage all parents to register as early as possible.

## What do I need to submit for my registration to be complete?

:: Your camper will officially be on our roster when we have received a registration form and registration fee. All paperwork must be turned in, and deposits must be paid by 4/30 (or at the time of registration after 4/30) to remain on our roster. Remaining balance is due the Friday before each week of camp to remain on our roster for that week.

## How much does it cost?

:: Camp Crusader weekly tuition is \$185.00. You can pay by the week, or take advantage of a full summer discount until 4/30. Full summer is \$1,530.00. If paying by the week, a \$75.00 deposit on all weekly reservations is due by 4/30, or at the time of registration if you register after 4/30. \*\*\*Please note: Before 3/1 the registration fee is \$50.00, for SLKF students registered for the 2022-2023 school year. After 3/1, the registration fee is \$75.00. (Registration fee includes 1 camp crusader t-shirt!)

## How can I pay, and are there any deadlines I need to know about?

:: You can pay via cash or check and all payments must be made in the SLKF School office. Space is limited, and the sooner you get your registration packet and registration fee paid the better! If you want to take advantage of our full summer discount - the last day is 4/30. If paying by the week, all weekly reservation deposits are due by 4/30, or with registration if you register after 4/30.

All tuition balances and lunch add-ons are due by the Friday before your camper is set to come to camp. Camp Crusader does not offer refunds.

## What do you mean “no refunds”?

:: Camp Crusader does not offer refunds for deposits, tuition, and/or lunch payments.

## How does the lunch program work?

:: Camp Crusader offers lunch and snack to campers daily. Lunches are \$25/week and snacks are included in the weekly tuition. Pizza is always free on Fridays. (\*If your camper does not want pizza, you MUST pack a lunch.) Lunch includes a drink, entree, and side. Snack includes one snack from the snack cart.

All lunches are pre-paid. All lunch payments must be made by Friday of the week prior to your camper attending camp. There are no refunds or rollovers on lunch funds regardless of absence, holiday, or unexpected camp closure.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



## Do we really get free pizza?

:: Yes! We love our campers and counselors. We treat everyone to up to 2 pieces of pizza, and a drink on Fridays.

## If my child is absent, do the lunch/snack funds roll over or get refunded?

:: No. There will be no refunds for lunch payments.

## How does drop off and pick up work?

:: You can drop off your camper as early as 7:45am. All parents must bring campers to the double doors of Marion Hall (closest to the Church) for drop off. No camper should be dropped off in the parking lot or left unattended at any time. Campers may be picked up at the double doors of Marion Hall between 3:30pm and 4:00pm.

## Do I really need to be on time?

:: We highly recommend having your camper in the classroom by 8:15am. This gives your camper time to get settled before moving to the activity.

## How does swimming and water play work?

:: Campers have free swim most days for 45-60 minutes. The pool is staffed by 2 Red Cross certified lifeguards at all times. In addition, 1 counselor remains in the pool at arms length of swimmers at all times.

All campers who want to swim, must take a swim test before being allowed to swim. Any camper who does not pass the swim test must bring a flotation device to wear. Camp Crusader cannot provide any flotation devices. Campers who do not pass the swim test and do not bring a flotation device may not enter the pool area.

## Can you tell me a little bit about programming at Camp Crusader?

:: The programming at Camp Crusader consists of in-house classes and presentations. We have several educators on staff who teach classes in Art, S.T.E.M., Music, Dance, and Sports. In addition, we have in-house presentations from all around the city who bring special programming to our campers. Past presentations have included the Audubon Aquavan, Bug Mobile, Zoo Mobile, Wetlands Express, Bubby's Snoballs, Expedition Earth, Red Barn Farm, and many others!

## What are the camper/counselor ratios?

:: We like to keep our camp groups small! Our ratios average 2:16 for Pre-K and 2-3:18-25 for K-7th.
